Dr Amer Siddiq is an Associate Professor, Consultant Psychiatrist and Smoking Cessation Specialist from University Malaya. He is the coordinator of the Nicotine Addiction Research Group of UMCAS and is the primary investigator for the Grand Challenge Grant (GC004-15HTM) investigating gaps in upscaling existing smoking cessation services in Malaysia. He is a technical and expert advisor to the Ministry of Health for policy documents

including the Tobacco Control National Strategic Plan 2015-2020 document and mQuit Services project which is involved in strengthening the "O" of MPOWER.



Dr Abdul Rasyid is currently the Senior Lecturer of International Medical University (IMU). Prior to this, he was the Lecturer of Department of Psychological Medicine, Faculty of Medicine, University of Malaya until 2016. Welcome Message from the President of AMAM & FPMPAM



This specialty event have been designed to cater for the CME/CPD interest of specialists and those with special interest in addiction medicine. On behalf of the Addiction Medicine Association of Malaysia (AMAM) and the Federation of Private Practitioners'

Associations Malaysia, I would like to invite you to this special event, the 11th National Conference on Addiction Medicine (11th NatCAM).

Since 2002, the FPMPAM and the AMAM (founded in 2006) have worked closely together and developed a community-based MAT program. More than 900 GPs have been trained in the use of MAT and they are able to offer treatment for these patients within the community setting. To date, our nation-wide community-based MAT program have taken more than more than 24,000 patients with heroin addiction off the streets. Retention treatment rates have been more than 60% when the data was last analysed in 2014. Within 2 years following the introduction of MAT in Malaysia, important parameters like HIV-associated IV drug use death rate and drug-related arrests have been shown to fall significantly. This experience have been similar in countries that have advocated this policy.

Since 2016, statistics from the NADA have shown a worrisome reversal of the trend with an increasing number of drug related arrests. This is an indication that affirmative regulatory reform is needed for maintaining and upscaling MAT.

The 11th NatCAM will specifically address issues related to drug addiction and its treatment. We have put together a team of experts who will be sharing their experiences and knowledge with our members and practitioners working at ground zero of the addiction disease landscape.
